F. Public Comment Session

Janet Rose, Currituck County Schools teacher, thanked Superintendent Sholar for thinking of students and staff when making the decisions to cancel school due to inclement weather. As president of the local NCAE chapter, Mrs. Rose spoke about the concerns with the 25% teacher employment law and provided the Board with a list of

> staff members who will decline to sign. Mrs. Rose asked the Board to adopt a resolution opposing the legislation.

> Will Crodick, parent and resident of Knotts Island, spoke about the 38 million dollar school budget and the 14 combination classes in the district. Mr. Crodick spoke negatively about the combination classes. He felt the classes caused low self-esteem in students and forced teachers to multi-task. He suggested that 1% of the budget be used to fund a teacher for each classroom and put an end to combination classes.

Christine Kasten, guidance counselor at JP Knapp Early College, invited parents to the school's March 9th meeting. The meeting will provide parents and interested students with information on attending the early college next school year.

Karen Etheridge publically thanked Janet Rose for her work in NCAE and urged people to contact their legislators about raises for all teachers.

Jackie Simmons visited JES and was impressed with the students presenting the wax museum. He attended a recent meeting on Common Core that was very informative and he also thanked those that showed support by opposing the proposed tolls on the Knotts Island Ferry.

Dwan Craft recognized the CCHS track team for placing second in the state. Mrs. Craft has been out visiting schools and visited several combination classes. She was very pleased with the schools.

Darnell Gaddis attended the staff development with Eric Jensen who spoke on student stresses and the support of teachers. She too was thankful for the support against tolls on the Knotts Island Ferry.

Dr. Dobney congratulated Rick Lage and Thomas Poston on their accomplishments. He added that legislators omitted approximately 68,000 teachers from the proposed salary increase. During his recent visit to schools, he was very impressed with student engagement
