4. Revision to Regulation Code: 3400 R - Evaluating Student Progress

Assistant Superintendent, Sandy Kinzel, informed the Board of changes to the district's regulations for Policy 3400 Evaluating Student Progress. The changes are due to revision of State Board of Education Policy GCS-L-004. This policy contains the standards for Electronically Generated High School Transcripts.

Effective with the 2015-16 school year, all students in grades 9 - 12 will be graded using a ten (10) point grading scale with 90 - 100 an "A"; 80 - 89 a "B"; 70 - 79 a "C"; and 60 -69 a "D." There will be no plus/minus or augmented scales. Grades should be reported numerically. This grading scale should also be used with any course taught in middle school that carries high school credit. Effective with the Freshman Class of 2015, a new weighting scale will apply to honors and college-level classes. Honors credit beyond standard weights will carry an additional .5 quality point and any college-level course -- AP, IB, community college (authorized additional weight by the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement), university -- will carry an additional 1.0 quality point. The maximum credits earned would be 4.5 for an "A" in honors and 5.0 for an "A" on a college-level course. Upperclassmen will continue with the current weighting system through graduation.

In addition to these changes specific to high schools, Currituck County Schools will use a 10 point grade scale for grades 3-12 beginning 2015-16 and report Honor Roll for high schools at the end of each semester.

Because the revisions are to current regulations and not to Board policy, a vote is not required.

C. 21st Century Systems

1. Superintendent Vacancy Announcement, Search Timeline and Community & Staff Input Survey (Action)

Dr. Dobney announced the superintendent search will be conducted inhouse rather than using a search agency. Knowledge of Currituck County School or demographics that are similar to the county is preferred. The application is available on-line rather than paper copies which reduce the cost of mailing, handling, etc. The application deadline is June 10, 2015. The announcement and online application will also be sent to various agencies that will advertise- including nationally.

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An on-line survey and public and staff meetings will be used to gather the communities' input on the preferred characteristics and qualities of a superintendent

3. Requesting Increase to School Lunch Cost beginning 2015-2016 School Year (Action)

Angela Rodriguez, Child Nutrition Director, explained how student lunch and breakfast costs are formulated by comparing the difference between paid lunch reimbursement and cost to free & reduce reimbursement. The difference is reviewed annually. Ms. Rodriguez recommended a price increase of .15 to all lunches. This would increase elementary lunch to \$2.50 and middle & high school lunch to \$2.75. Breakfast costs will remain the same.

Dwan Craft said she did not want to increase prices but realized there were compliance issues. Mr. Simmons also expressed his concern with the increase being passed to parents. A student that buys lunch every day will pay \$27 more a school year. Mr. Simmons added that he was pleased to see more fresh fruits and vegetables being served. Ms. Rodriguez added that with the new bid process she was hoping to serve additional new items.
