- 7. Read to Achieve and Summer School Schedule Sandy Kinzel, Assistant Superintendent, announced the districts plans for the summer reading camp. The camp will provide services to students who do not meet the state's reading proficiency by the end of the 3rd grade. According to legislative guidelines the program will be six weeks long with three hours a day of instruction. Included in \$51, 670 budget is transportation, teacher salaries, curriculum materials and child nutrition services. Camps will be held at Shawboro Elementary, Knotts Island Elementary and Griggs Elementary from 8:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. Mon.-Thurs., beginning June 30th through Aug 7th. Neighborhood bus stops will be established. Partnerships haven been developed with the County's 4H and Currituck YMCA. Special rates are available to parents. The district will first identify 3rd graders and then invite 2nd and 1st grade students to participate as capacity levels allow.

 event, asked the Board for funding. Last year's activities included indoor karting
 and laser tag. Various prizes such as electronics and items helpful for college life
