3. Night of 1000 Stars Reading Challenge sponsored by Whalehead Superintendent Sholar presented information on the Night of 1000 Stars Reading Challenge. She explained the challenge started through a partnership with Whalehead and introduced Ray Meiggs, Chief Executive Officer, and Ann Sensibaugh, Director of Education. Whalehead has been able to reach out to Currituck County Schools with internships. Now with the challenge in place, 106 teachers are participating with over 2,000 students reading. Whalehead's grand illumination, scheduled for December 6th, will showcase the students'

4. Accountability Results

Paul O'Briant, Chief Information Officer, reported on the district's accountability results. Mr. O'Briant spoke on and explained the Annual Measurable Objectives (AMO's) used to determine progress. He also explained how the EVAAS system is used to review and compare student data in a particular class. The proficiency rates are low because of so many changes, including changes in the curriculum. The standards are higher and the curriculum is rigorous. The standards not only ask if the student is ready for the next grade level, but are they on track for college ready. Mr. O'Briant presented the proficiency percentages for each school. Principals have the disaggregated data they will use to identify areas of improvement in the schools. There are a lot of complexities. Realizing the effect, NC State Board of Education voted not to negativity impact the students. Students will bring home individual reports this week.
