3. Lunch Price Increase (Action)

Angela Rodriquez, Child Nutrition Director, asked the Board for permission to increase school lunch prices by .15. The increase will assist with the cost of equipment maintenance, staff development, and increasing food costs. Middle and elementary lunch prices will increase from \$2.00 to \$2.15 and high school from \$2.25 to \$2.40. Dr. Dobney and Mr. Simmons expressed their favor of approving only a .10 increase. The Board discussed the probability of increasing prices again next year and corrective actions that could be issued by the Department of Public Instruction regarding meal prices. Breakfast and reduced meal prices will remain the same.
