D. Globally Competitive Students

1. Update on Regional Vocational Training Center Sandy Kinzel, Assistant Superintendent, gave an update on the district's efforts to create a Technical Training Center for high school students. The effort began with a discussion among community partners who need to hire trained workers.

There is a projection that over 200 homes will be built in Currituck County per year between the years 2015-2035. This will create a need for high quality Career & Technical Education opportunities. It is the district's vision to design classes and curriculum that is more application/lab based.

She reviewed the process which included a team of stakeholders and administrators from local districts brainstorming the idea and the need for the technical center. Mrs. Kinzel noted that the current graduation requirements of one size fits all presents obstacles. State BOE Representative, Becky Taylor attended the last meeting to hear the groups efforts. She was very receptive. The district will continue to contact local representatives and work with stakeholders. College Of the Albemarle will be brought into the discussion. Since other school districts are interested, a neutral location for the center is needed.

Will Crodick stated that he was concerned with math scores and would continue to bring the issue up for discussion. Dr. Dobney said the current three maths cause students to struggle where as a technical math could be available. There is a need for the practical application of mathematics.

Janet Rose asked about Engage NY and the positive comments that she has heard from teachers. Ms. Kinzel stated the program had positive outcomes.

Ms. Kinzel explained the vocational effort was still in its infancy. Additional discussion is needed and the group will seek the support of the local community college.

Will Crodick said he was not against working with other districts to create technical opportunities for students, but a strong math background was necessary.
