C. 21st Century Professionals

1. National Board Certified Teacher Recognition

Christine Hodges, Instructional Coordinator, recognized Debra Archer and Ann Rodgers for receiving renewal of NBCT. Mrs. Hodges explained the NBCT process and the importance of the certification and the impact it can make on how a teacher teaches. Currituck County has 59 certified teachers with 39 actively teaching. The process can take three years to complete. It was also announced that due to the work of Mrs. Hodges, RESA has agreed to provide some funding to assist teachers with endeavor.

The Board congratulated the teachers.

D. 21st Century Systems

 Approval of 2016 FY Audit Report (Action)
 Pete Catalfamo of Catalfamo & Associates presented a summary of the FY 2016 Audit Report.

Mr. Catalfamo said there were late deposits in the schools again. Controls have been put in place and compliance will continue to be monitored. Late deposit incidents are declining.

Mr. Catalfamo explained that late invoices were satisfied with a budget amendment and an over payment in payroll was reconciled. He went on to explain that late deposits are deposits that exceed \$250 and not deposited daily or regardless of the amount by the end of the month. Of course weekends or holidays are taken into consideration.

Mr. Stefanik said last year a summary was provided to the state on how the district would reduce the number of late deposits. Mr. Catalfamo said it was a repetitive issue and is required in the audit process. Mr.

Catalfamo said teachers should turn money into the bookkeeper each day.

Mr. Catalfamo continued with the summary. He presented a letter to BOE members only that addresses sub-topics and disagreements with management - which were none.

Mr. Crodick inquired about the adjustments and asked for an explanation. Mr. Catalfamo explained the adjustments and receivables.
