Athletic Trainers & Children's Hospital of the King's Daughters Earlier in the work session, Mitch Callis of CHKD presented to the Board a program that supplies schools with athletic trainers at a minimal cost. By offsetting the expense through advertisements, the cost can be reduced by 1/3 from approximately \$60,000 to \$20,000.
